> I thought to myself, "This has to be at least one of my New Year's resolutions: to take some time during each week, to bask in the glory of God's good creation, outside, wherever I might be." God speaks to me in moments like these; and I am able to more freely speak to God in the great outdoors. It is glorious to me, and I hope to God, to spend time together like this.



The Walk to Emmaus is an experience of Christian spiritual renewal and formation that begins with a three day short course in Christianity. It is an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God's grace and love is revealed to you through other believers. This is a spiritual walk, not a physical one.

The objective of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge, and equip the local church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, communities and places of work. Emmaus lifts up a way for our grace-filled lives to be lived and shared with others.

Each pilgrim is assigned a sponsor who will explain the walk, help with logistics, and answer questions. It's not too early to sign up for 2020. Applications are already coming in. If you wish to attend, but these dates do not work for you, contact Dot or Eben Files.



The Stewardship of Life

Sentenced to Homelessness

In this paraphrase from Genesis 4, we find the first murder of the Bible:

Eve gave birth to Cain, and then his brother Abel. Abel was a keeper of flocks, but Cain was a farmer, a tiller of the ground. In time Cain brought an offering to the LORD of the fruit of the ground. Abel also brought an offering of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions. The LORD had regard for Abel and for his offering; but not for Cain and for his offering. So Cain became very angry and his face fell. Then the LORD said to Cain, "Why are you angry? And why has your face fallen? If you do well, will not your face be lifted up? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it." Cain told Abel his brother, and when they were in the field, Cain rose up against Abel his brother and killed him.

Then the Lord said to Cain, "Where is Abel your brother?" And he said, "I do not know. Am I my brother's keeper?" He said, "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood is crying to Me from the ground. Now you are cursed from the ground, which has opened its mouth to receive your brother's blood from your hand. When you cultivate the ground, it will no longer yield its strength to you; you will be a vagrant and a wanderer on the earth." Cain said to the Lord, "My punishment is too great to bear! You have driven me this day from the face of the ground; and from Your face I will be hidden, and I will be a vagrant and a wanderer on the earth, and whoever finds me will kill me." So the Lord said to him, "Therefore whoever kills Cain, vengeance will be taken on him sevenfold." And the Lord put a mark on Cain, so that no one finding him would slay him. Then Cain went out from the presence of the Lord, and settled in the land of Nod, east of Eden.

I believe that by the time Cain was born, the Lord had already made known to mankind that for God to forgive sin, it was necessary for man to shed the blood of animals. Cain's giving an offering of plants was appropriate, as we learn in the time of Moses, but only after the forgiveness that came from animal sacrifice. [Now we are exempt from the law of blood sacrifices because Jesus' sacrifice was sufficient for all time.] Cain's offering of plants was a deliberate violation of God's instruction; Cain was telling God that the farm offering was a lot of work and God should be happy with it. The sentence imposed by God as judge made it very clear that God's law is supreme, not man's.

In time Cain established a new home, "east of Eden." But history has not forgotten Cain's sin or his punishment.


