Who invited you into the life of faith? Who invited you to explore and to learn more about Jesus? Who invited you to church? How is your life different because of it?

This month, on September 15<sup>th</sup>, we are participating in the national back to church campaign, *Back to Church Together*. I am hoping you have already seen the flier that we will use to invite our friends, neighbors, co-workers, classmates and others to church. We recognize that there are people all around us who have never set foot in a church, or have stepped away from the church for numbers of reasons. On September 15<sup>th</sup> we will take the opportunity not only to invite, but to say to others, “Let’s do this together.” Then go pick them up and bring them church! One simple, seemingly insignificant invitation has the power for others to experience the life-changing power and presence of God!

Scott Chrostek recently spoke of our reluctance to extend an invitation to come to church. It makes us feel uncomfortable. Perhaps we don’t want our world to collide with the people we work with or our Friday night friends. We don’t want our lives intersecting with theirs outside of those settings because they might see inconsistencies in our behaviors and begin to question us. We prefer to keep our lives compartmentalized.

Or, perhaps we are afraid to invite because we don’t have all of the answers. We are not experts. We think that if we invite a person to faith they are going start asking questions we just don’t have the answers for.

Or, perhaps we don’t want to risk the relationship. If we invite our neighbors to church and they say, “No,” it might change the relationship. It might become awkward. And if they say, “no,” at first, do you keep inviting?

If we look at John 1:43-52, we see Jesus making a simple invitation to those who began following him and questioning him after John called him Lamb of God. He simply said “come and see.” Then these disciples began to tell others that they had found the one Moses and the prophets talked about and they used Jesus’ same invitation: “Come and see. Come and see for yourself who this Jesus is.”

We are called to invite others into the life of faith always and everywhere. Don’t underestimate the power such an invitation can hold. There are people who are hungering for an authentic relationship with God; who need a community of believers to help them navigate this complicated world in which we live; who want a safe environment to help raise their children in the faith.

Who will you invite to church on September 15<sup>th</sup>?

The Quest is a challenge to accept the invitation. This is a six-session, video based excursion with Jesus. Learn to promote intimacy with God through prayer. Explore questions and responses from the Bible. Track your quest by journaling along the way. Learn to read and respond to Scripture.



## The Stewardship of Life

### Homeless by Consequence

Our Bible begins, *“In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.” Genesis 1:1* As we keep reading, we find that *“The Lord God planted a garden toward the east, in Eden; and there He placed the man whom He had formed.” Genesis 2:8* Creation was perfect: Man was created in the image of God. All his needs were met by the perfect place he was given to be his home. All that was needed was for man to enjoy regular fellowship with God, delight in the blessing of the garden, and oversee the creation that God put in his care. Then came the Fall.

When Adam and Eve disobeyed the command of God to keep away from the tree of knowledge of good and evil, there were consequences (*Genesis 3*). They were separated from God, they had to work for their food, and they were driven out of the Garden (made homeless). Similarly, their first son, Cain, murdered his brother, Abel (*Genesis 4*). Included in Cain’s punishment was that he was no longer allowed to be a farmer but was sentenced to be a vagrant and a wanderer (*Genesis 4:12*). It appears that homelessness was a transient situation for Adam and Eve that was resolved when they established a new, though less perfect, home. The situation appears chronic, or permanent, for Cain. God labeled Cain so as he wandered, he would be recognized and shunned, but not killed.

It seems that almost daily there are news reports regarding homelessness. Although I was born homeless and many times have been temporarily without a home, I have never not known when I would again have a home. I am calling this form of homelessness “homeless by consequence.” When one makes a decision or takes action that results in his having no home, homelessness is a consequence of the decision or action. I have included it here because it comes first in our Bible. I can not say whether it is more important or more common than any other form of homelessness.

It is my purpose in this series that, as we examine occasions of homelessness in the lives of Biblical characters, we will learn more about contemporary homelessness, and how best to deal with it.


